Alternative Criteria for Graduate Status for the Department of Economics

Associate Graduate Faculty Status within the Department of Economics grants the member the ability to teach graduate level economic courses EC5000-7000 and MBA 5200 and 7220. Associate Graduate Faculty Status are listed as Criteria (a), (b), and (c) in university Policy 2160.3. The Economics Department recognizes the following alternative to Criterion (a) and (c).

1.	In lieu of Criterion (a) appropriate terminal degree:
	Required: Master's degree in Economics or related area, such as: Supply Chain Managemen Logistics, Public Policy, or subject matter over-lapping with the content of the Master's in Social + Applied Economics (MSAE).

2.	In lieu of Criterion (c) current (within the past seven years) and relevant record of scholarly or creative accomplishment through metrics such as research, publications, professional activities, and/or creative work (as appropriate to the field):
C.	quired: Minimum of 7 points total in the previous seven years from Categories A, B and Points can be given to multiple years in Category A and multiple occurrences of an ivity in Category B.
