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- In order to be admitted fully as a social work major at Wright State, students will need to achieve a cumulative GPA of a 2.25.
- Students must earn a C or higher in ENG 1101, ENG 1201, SWK 1206, and SWK 1213 at Sinclair.
- Students must complete the following coursework at Sinclair prior to being fully admitted to the Social Work program: BIO 1111, COM 2206, ECO 1100 or 2160 or 2180, ENG 1101, ENG 1201, PLS 1120 or 2200, PSY 1100, SOC 1101, SWK 1206, and SWK 1213.
- Students must submit a separate application form to the Social Work program by February 1 during their second or sophomore year (while studying at Sinclair).
- 128-133 hours minimum are required for a BA degree at Wright State.

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Students interested in applying to the Wright Path must submit a request for membership at [wright.edu/sinclair](http://wright.edu/sinclair).

High school students must be close to graduating before applying to the Wright Path, and current Sinclair College students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

## ***Transfer to Wright State University***

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Sinclair College in order to transfer to Wright State.

Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA from Sinclair College in order to transfer to Wright State. To be admitted into the Social Work Program at Wright State, students must earn a minimum 2.25 GPA from Sinclair College.

Students must apply for admission to Wright State and the Social Work program by February 1 of the sophomore year/year two (while still studying at Sinclair).

\*Note that students must apply and be admitted to the university before Social Work Program application can be approved.

Students must earn a C or higher in ENG 1101, ENG 1201, SWK 1206, and SWK 1213 at Sinclair.

Students must complete the following coursework at Sinclair prior to being fully admitted to the Social Work program: BIO 1111, COM 2206, ECO 1100 or 2160 or 2180, ENG 1101, ENG 1201, PLS 1120 or 2200, PSY 1100, SOC 1101, SWK 1206, and SWK 1213.
