



**Richard V. “Dick” Reynolds**, Lieutenant General, United States Air Force (retired), is owner of The VanFleet Group, LLC, an aerospace consulting company. He also serves as an Independent/Outside Director for Advanced Integration Technology, LP and The Fifth Street Brewpub Co-operative. He was previously a Director for Allison Transmission Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: ALSN); Capability Analysis & Measurement Organization, LLC; Apogee Enterprises, Inc. (NASDAQ: APOG); Barco Federal Systems, LLC; Electronic Warfare Associates - Government Systems, Inc.; Sierra Nevada Corporation; GE Rolls-Royce Fighter Engine Team, LLC; and Systems & Technology Research, LLC. In a volunteer capacity, he is an Emeritus Trustee and past President and Board Chair of the Air Force Museum Foundation, Inc. He served as Community

Champion and Fundraising Committee Chair for the \$6.5 million Dayton VA Medical Center Fisher House and is presently a member of the National Veterans Memorial and Museum Veterans Advisory Committee; co-founder, Vice Chair and Secretary of Air Camp, Inc.; a Trustee of the United States Air and Trade Show and Flight Test Museum Foundation; and a founding Director of the Department of Veterans Affairs History Center Foundation. In 2021, the Presidents Club of Dayton selected General Reynolds as the 70<sup>th</sup> recipient of the region’s Citizen Legion of Honor Award, the oldest, most continuous and prestigious recognition of volunteer servant leadership in the Dayton region. In July 2022, he was recognized with the Ford Oval of Honor. In 2009-2011, General Reynolds chaired the Committee on Evaluation of U.S. Air Force Preacquisition Technology Development for the National Research Council of the National Academy of Science and served on the Air Force Studies Board. He also served as a member of the Intelligence Science and Technology Experts Group of the NAS. Prior to his retirement in 2005, General Reynolds was Vice Commander, Air Force Materiel Command. During his 34-years of active-duty Air Force service, he commanded the Aeronautical Systems Center at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio and the Air Force Flight Test Center at Edwards Air Force Base, California. He was also Program Executive Officer, Airlift and Trainers in the Pentagon, and Program Director for several major weapon system acquisitions, including the B-2 Spirit. General Reynolds was a distinguished graduate of Class 79B and Onizuka Prop Wash Award winner at the U.S. Air Force Test Pilot School and has more than 25 years of hands-on experience in the research, development, program management, test and evaluation of aeronautical systems. He holds Federal Aviation Administration certificates for Airline Transport Pilot and Flight Instructor (Glider), and his logbook shows more than 4,000 flying hours in 72 different military and civil aircraft. Graduating in 1971 from the U.S. Air Force Academy with a Bachelor of Science degree in Aeronautical Engineering, General Reynolds has a Master of Science degree in Mechanical Engineering from California State University, and a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College. He is a Fellow of the Society of Experimental Test Pilots.
